


2022 CANADIAN OLYMPIC SNOWBOARD TEAM

OLYMPIC QUOTA

The IOC determines the number of athletes that may compete at the 2022 OWG by establishing quotas per discipline for each country participating in the Games. The Canada Snowboard quota is guided by the IOC Qualification System.

Available quota will be allocated to the nations based on the top ranking athletes on the FIS Olympic Qualification List until nations meet the limit of 4 per gender per discipline, if a nation passes their limit the next top athlete on the ranking list would be awarded a quota for their nation.


WHAT MAKES ME ELIGIBLE?



Are you a **CANADIAN CITIZEN** with a valid passport that does not expire prior to **AUGUST 28, 2022?**

Are you in good standing with **CANADA SNOWBOARD** and meet the following **FIS REQUIREMENTS?**

- One top 30, within the top 3rd of the field, at World Cup or World Championships; and
- At least 100 FIS points (SBX, PGS)
- At least 50 FIS points (SBS\BA, HP)

You are eligible for nomination to the Olympic team. To be nominated to the Olympic team please keep reading.

ELIGIBLE COMPETITIONS FOR NOMINATION

For an athlete to be considered for nomination by Canada Snowboard to the 2022 Canadian Olympic team, specific competitions for each discipline have been identified as the ones to be used to determine the nomination (selection) of any given athlete to the team. These competitions are deemed "eligible competitions" meaning they are the only ones from which the results will be used when determining nominations. These competitions are listed for both Method 'A' and Method 'B' Nomination Processes and occur during a specified "Selection Period".

SPEED SELECTION PERIOD

July 1, 2020 to January 14, 2022, inclusive.

Eligible competitions for nomination to the Speed Disciplines (Parallel Giant Slalom and Snowboardcross) Olympic team shall be defined as (PGS or SBX) **FIS World Cups**, and the **2021 FIS Snowboard World Championships PGS or SBX events** during the speed selection period.

FREESTYLE SELECTION PERIOD

July 1, 2020 to January 10, 2022, inclusive.

Eligible competitions for the freestyle disciplines shall consist of World Snowboarding Points List (WSPL) ranked events worth 700 WSPL points or higher during the selection period.

NOMINATION PROCESS

METHOD 'A' EARLY NOMINATION

- Eligible Competitions -

A maximum of 2 Athletes per Gender per discipline may be nominated, on a provisional basis, to the COC based on the results in their respective competitions described below.

SPEED (PGS, SBX)

All 2020-21 (PGS or SBX) FIS World Cups and the 2021 FIS Snowboard World Championships.

FREESTYLE (SBS, BA, HP)

All 2020-21 World Snowboarding Points Lists (WSPL) ranked events worth 700 WSPL points or higher.*


The maximum number of eligible athletes that may be nominated to the COC through Method 'A' and the **Canadian Winter Olympic Selection Tour** competitions are:



BIG AIR

In this case, there would be 1 athlete nominated for Slopestyle and 1 for Big Air.

1 To be provisionally nominated to the COC through Method 'A' an **eligible** athlete must do the following:



RANK WITHIN THE TOP 3

in the world ranking of their discipline

SPEED: FIS Base List 21-22 (posted post 20-21 season)

FREESTYLE: WSPL Rankings as of July 1, 2021



SLOPESTYLE & BIG AIR

For Slopestyle and Big Air, both discipline rankings in the top 3 will be eligible and included into the ranking process below. A minimum result of a top 8 and top third (1/3) of the field placing is required in both disciplines at an eligible competition.

2 Eligible athletes who are ranked within the top three (3) in the world at the end of the Method 'A' Selection Period (July 1, 2021) will be ranked according to the following procedure:

a

Ten (10) ranking lists will be created, one for each gender in Slopestyle, Big Air, Parallel Giant Slalom, and Snowboardcross.

PGS & Snowboardcross: Will be ranked by their best three (3) final results from eligible competitions based on the FIS points allocation.

Halfpipe: Will be ranked by their best three (3) Halfpipe results from eligible competitions based on their WSPL points allocation.

Slopestyle & Big Air: will be ranked by their best three (3) Slopestyle and best three (3) Big Air results from eligible competitions based on their WSPL points allocation.

b

In the event of a tie, the athlete with the single highest field placing breaking the tie from above will be selected.

c

In the unlikely event that less than three (3) events of the Method 'A' Eligible Competitions for Slopestyle or Big Air happen, athletes can still qualify for Method 'A' through the opposite discipline. In the unlikely event Slopestyle and Big Air both have less than three (3) events, athletes may only be nominated by method 'B' outlined below.

In the unlikely event that less than three (3) events of the **Method 'A' Eligible Competitions** for Halfpipe, Parallel Giant Slalom or Snowboardcross happen, athletes may only be nominated by **Method 'B'** outlined below.



For nomination to the 2022 Olympic Team, Athletes provisionally nominated through Method 'A' must be ranked within the top number of athletes to receive a quota on the FIS Olympic Quota Allocation List at the end of the OWG quota allocation period, January 17, 2022.

SPEED DISCIPLINES - SBX & PGS




PRIORITY 1


PRIORITY 2

1 Top 4 Final Result at FIS World Cup. **OR** 2021 FIS Snowboard World Championships (Athletes with multiple will be ranked higher)




PRIORITY 3

2 Top 8 Final Results at eligible competitions during the selection period



PRIORITY 4

Demonstrates 2026 medal potential as determined by the athlete performance curves, Canada Snowboard's Gold Medal Profile, and Podium Pathway



PRIORITY 5

Best 2 final results, which; the result must be within the top 1/3 of the field at an eligible competition during the selection period

In the event of a tie in the result(s) in the implementation of the above nomination process, the tie will be broken by the tied athlete's single best percentile of field placing, then 2nd best, 3rd best, and so on, until the tie is broken. Only results from eligible competitions will be considered. Percentile of field placing is calculated according to the following formula: (Field size - Placing) / Field Size x 100.

Athletes who are eligible and selected to participate in the individual Snowboardcross event are also eligible for potential selection to participate in the Mixed Team Snowboardcross Event. The selection for the Mixed Gender Snowboardcross team event will be made by the Snowboardcross head coach(es) onsite during the 2022 Beijing Games based on fielding the best competitive team at the games.

FREESTYLE DISCIPLINES - SBS, BA & HP

To be eligible for the ranking process in Method 'B' - Athletes must achieve a minimum of a single result within the top third (1/3) of the field at an eligible competition, being a 700 WSPL point or higher event during the selection period January 1, 2021 - January 10, 2022.

SLOPESTYLE & BIG AIR

The Slopestyle & Big Air ranking lists will use their best three (3) Slopestyle and best three (3) Big Air results.

75% of the total points from the best 3 results in Slopestyle and 25% of the total points from the best 3 results in Big Air will be used to determine the ranks of the athletes for the remaining Olympic quota spots and up to 3 additional alternates.

IN THE EVENT OF A FURTHER TIE

In the event of a tie on the Slopestyle & Big Air ranking list the athlete with the next best single result at an eligible event based on WSPL points in Slopestyle will be used until the tie is broken.

HALFPIPE

The halfpipe ranking list will be used to determine the ranks of the athletes for the remaining Olympic quota spots and up to 3 additional alternates.

IN THE EVENT OF A TIE

In the event of a tie on the Halfpipe ranking list, the athlete with the next best result at an eligible event based on WSPL points in Halfpipe will be used until the tie is broken to award the remaining Olympic Quota Spot.

CANADA SNOWBOARD QUOTA ALLOCATION: Based on the maximum allowed team size of Snowboard, if Canada Snowboard at the end of the quota allocation period obtains more than 14 quota for a gender or a total of 26 quotas for all the disciplines then the eligible riders meeting method 'B' priorities will be ranked across all disciplines based on the Quota Allocation 'B' Priorities, which can be found in the full version of the INP.
